

The Resurrection Part 1



The main idea of John 20:19-31:

Jesus was raised from the dead so we might receive Him, believe Him and have life in His name.

The following questions can be used during a family worship time. Take time as a family this week to talk about the Story and what you are learning as you read. The hymns on the next pages are from our worship service. Sing them together as a family during your family worship time this week.

Discussion questions:

Why do you think Jesus was resurrected from the dead?

After Jesus died, why did some of His followers come to the tomb? What does this tell you about friendship and loyalty among Jesus' companions?

What difference can or does it make in your life knowing that Jesus is alive today?



When we understand the message of the Bible and enter a restored relationship with God, we want to share it with others. Who is one person you are praying will enter a relationship with Jesus and how are you seeking to reach out to him or her? How can your family encourage you in this relationship and support you in prayer?

As a family:

Create a list of the people you love and care about who have not discovered the truth of God's story and who are not yet in a relationship with God through faith in Jesus. Commit to use this list as a prayer reminder. Also, seek opportunities to share God's story and your story with them.
