Have you ever felt unqualified or unable to do something, as Moses did? How did you handle it?


What can you learn about the character of God from the story of the Israelites' deliverance from slavery?

What is one area of your life where you tend to focus more on your limitations than God's ability to work through you?


As a family:


Come, Behold the Wondrous Mystery




