Genesis 22:1-18



The main idea of Genesis 22:1-18:

God builds a nation to bless all nations out of those who sacrifice in order to obey Him.

The following questions can be used during a family worship time. Take time as a family this week to talk about the Story and what you are learning as you read. The hymns on the next pages are from our worship service. Sing them together as a family during your family worship time this week.

Discussion questions:

Have you ever done something that seemed impossible at first? What did you do? What made you decide to go ahead and do the "impossible"?

What made Abraham righteous in God's sight? How is this fact relevant to your life?

Why is it so hard to be patient and wait on God's will for our lives?

When was a time God invited me to take a bold step of faith and I followed with confidence? (Thank God for carrying you through that time.)

As a family:

Together make a list. Each person add something to the list that means a great deal to them. One by one, offer the things on the list to God. If it is a person, surrender that loved one to the Lord. If it is a material thing, let God know that He has full access to it. If it is a talent or ability, tell God you will use it for Him. Take everything and freely offer it back to the One who gave you all you have been given.
